RE: Yearly Activity of the Bella Vista Police Department

Attached is the 2010 Yearly Report for the Bella Vista Police Department.

This year was difficult for the Bella Vista Police Department. We cannot ignore that the department was under a cloud for most of the year. An officer involved shooting in January resulted in criminal charges being filed and the officer arrested for manslaughter. The case continued until mid December when the former officer plead guilty to a reduced charge in the case. This was a tragic incident and the members of this department suffered along with everyone close to the case. We were able to provide consistent service to the community during this time.



During 2010, we were able to continue several worthwhile projects.

- Shop with a Cop - This year, we were able to sponsor twenty-one children. In 2010, we were able to work with the Gravette School System in addition to Cooper Elementary and other Bentonville schools with students from Bella Vista. When Metfield Neighborhood Grill closed in September, we lost our primary source of funding. The people of Bella Vista have been extremely supportive of this event. As a result, the program is financially stable and we do not have to rush to find another fundraiser.
- K-9 Fund – Our K-9 unit started operation in late June. The K-9 has been used on several cases. He has successfully located drugs, but no major quantities.
- Staffing – In December, we were able to hire and equip three new officers using the proceeds of the sales tax. These officers started at the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy in early January 2011. All new personnel will be assigned to the patrol division.

We look forward to 2011 and have several goals for the year.

- Staffing – The new officers will reduce the pressure on our shifts. We plan to increase traffic enforcement and community involvement.
- Training – We plan to continue our in house training program and send employees to available training to benefit the professionalism of the department and individual. The in house training program will be modified to include sexual harassment training annually. A priority this year will be to finish sending command staff to leadership training offered by the Criminal Justice Institute.

Thank you for your support in 2010. We look forward to a successful 2011.

Communication Division

2010 brought about another very busy year for the Bella Vista Emergency Communications Center. The phones are at least as busy, or busier, than last year and 911 calls seem to come in with the same frequency as the non-emergency calls. The good news is we are now able to track how many emergency and non-emergency calls come in and how many minutes were logged taking those calls. We are also able to track the amount of radio traffic coming in and going out of the communications center. Small step in the overall scheme of things, but it's a huge step in seeing where we have been and where we are going.



2010 marked an increase in walk in generated calls also. For the year of 2009 there were 399 walk in calls for service. 2010 shows 458 calls for service were generated by walk in traffic. That means dispatchers are dealing with more reporting parties face to face which also takes them away from the console for that period of time. If a person comes into the Police Department to file a report, pick up a copy of a report, ask for directions or just ask for general information, the dispatcher still has to answer phones and deal with radio traffic while helping that person without a delay.

In 2010 we continued to attempt to staff the communications center as much as possible with two dispatchers on day shift, two dispatchers on evening shift and one dispatcher on midnight shift. A lot of planning and effort goes into trying to make that ideal staffing possible, but the year end stats show that we were only able to do that 45% of the time. That means one dispatcher was handling all duties in the communications center 55% of the time alone.

2010 also brought multiple highs and lows. On a high note, Dispatcher Alisha Larson had a baby girl, Piper Lynn, in March! Alisha was out for six weeks on maternity leave and luckily for us, she decided to return to the Bella Vista PD afterward. Alisha has been with the Bella Vista PD for a little over 2 years.

Dispatcher Blake Hughes joined our ranks in late September 2009 but was not released from training until almost 2010. Blake did very well in his first full year as an emergency dispatcher. Blake was on duty alone the night of the officer involved shooting on Hwy 340 near Harling Lane. He performed his duties like a seasoned veteran. Blake has quickly become an asset to the Bella Vista Police Department.

Dispatcher Jamie Abbott has been with the Bella Vista PD for two years. She came to us from Cencom (Benton County Central Communications) after 10 years of service. Jamie became very ill over the holiday season of 2010 and spent a few weeks in the hospital. With great care and under God's watchful eye, Jamie's recovery was quick and she is currently doing well. She was able to return to duty around the 1st of January 2011.

2010 opened doors for training opportunities also. March 23rd through the 27th Dispatcher Blake Hughes and Dispatcher Amber Bowman attended the National Child Passenger Safety Certification Program in Fayetteville, Arkansas. The training program is combination of classroom instruction, hands-on work with car seats and vehicles, and a community safety seat checkup event, where students demonstrate proper use and installation of child restraints and safety belts and then teach these skills to parents. Successful completion of this course certifies the individual as a CPS technician for two years. The Bella Vista Police Department does participate in a free car seat program. In order to obtain the seat, the person requesting it must bring the vehicle the child will be riding in and the child that will be using the seat, to the police department for a certified CPS installer to install the seat and demonstrate the proper use and safety aspects of the seat to the guardian. Blake and Amber are the only two certified installers in the communications division. They are two of only three certified installers in the whole department.

April 11th through the 14th, Dispatcher Michelle Ouillette and Dispatcher Jamie Abbott attended the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials / National Emergency Number Association state conference in Rogers, Arkansas. This conference gives dispatchers an opportunity to obtain continuing education credits by attending classes such as: storm spotting, swat and raid operations, soliciting critical information from child callers, handling suicide and hostage calls, and many more.

May of 2010 brought the Arkansas Crime Information Center Conference. Dispatcher Alisha Larson and Dispatcher Lisa Reed attended the conference in Hot Springs, Arkansas. It allows those in the law enforcement field to learn things about upcoming updates to the ACIC / NCIC terminal and operations. Training sessions on sex offender registry information, Leads on Labs (a nationwide database between pharmacies and law enforcement agencies aimed at eliminating meth labs), deciphering criminal returns, and national and local security procedures are among the many classes offered at this conference. This is a three day training session.

Along with daily duties performed and training attended, Communications personnel also found time to give back to the public. For the second year dispatchers participated in the Shop with a Cop program. This program provides funding for underprivileged children so they and their families can have a joyful holiday season. The joy in giving back is always seen and felt after

shopping with the kids. This opportunity will assuredly be something anticipated every year, just as it has been for the past two years.

Dispatch Supervisor Ron Towle participated in the Autism Involves Me fundraiser on April 10, 2010. The fundraiser was organized by the NWA Autism Support Group and was held at the Grace Point Church in Bentonville, Arkansas. The event drew in approximately 5,000 people. The purpose is to raise funds for those on the autism spectrum in Northwest Arkansas. The funds assist with things such as: various therapies, learning tools, and grants for education and medical assistance. Along with raising funds it also helps to raise awareness of the Autism spectrum. Ron assisted with the raffle and the silent auction and he also handmade the six trophies that were given to winners in the 5k run / walk and other various events.

The year of 2010 was riddled with setbacks but each setback is a platform for advancement; and there were advancements made. It was definitely one for the record books.

Communications Division


Statistics not commonly known

- There are nine phone lines for the Emergency Communications Center. They consist of two emergency phone lines (911 & 855-1122), four non-emergency phone lines (855-3771, 855-8046, 855-8047, 855-8030) and a ring down line from each of the three Bella Vista fire stations.
- Each phone line is monitored 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days per year.
- The nine phone lines listed above logged 71,172 minutes of usage for 2010.
- Total number of phone calls on the voice recorder for 2010 is 63,038 with an average of 1 minute and 7 seconds logged per call.
- Those numbers equal a phone call approximately every 7 minutes.
- There are six radio channels for the Emergency Communications Center. They consist of three police frequencies (PD 1, PD 2, PD 3), two fire frequencies (FD 1, FD 2) and the street department / POA frequency (street).
- Each radio frequency is monitored 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days per year.
- The six radio frequencies listed above logged 95953 minutes of usage for 2010.
- Total number of radio traffic recordings on the voice recorder for 2010 is 138983 with an average of 41 seconds per recording.
- Those numbers equal some form of radio traffic every 5 minutes.
- Combined radio and phone recordings show 167,125 minutes and total count of 202,021 recordings. That equals radio traffic to be given, answered, or monitored or a phone call to be answered or made every 3 minutes.
- 458 Calls for service were generated by walk in traffic at the Bella Vista Police Department. Initial contact with a walk in reporting party is done by a dispatcher. The dispatcher takes the initial complaint and records all pertinent information regarding the call prior to dispatching an officer to speak to the reporting party.
- The walk in number above does not reflect the total number of walk ins. Things unaccounted for are requests for directions, general information, dropping off paperwork, or picking up police reports. This number would be three to four times higher if those things were accounted for.
- Walk in reports are taken 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days per year.
- 89 calls for service were generated through the Arkansas Crime Information Center and National Crime Information Center terminal. This terminal is manned by a trained and certified dispatcher 24 / 7 / 365.
- There are seven dispatchers, including the Dispatch Supervisor, fully trained to operate the Emergency Communications Center.
- The goal is to have two dispatchers on all day shifts, all evening shifts, and one dispatcher on midnight shift. That is considered 100 % staffing.
- For the year of 2010, the communications center operated with one dispatcher per shift approximately 55% of the time. The shortage is due to multiple factors. This


includes, but is not limited to: maternity leave, long term medical leave, vacations, training, and sick days. Knowing this statistic, keep in mind the above statistic of a phone call or radio traffic every 3 minutes on average along with walk in traffic and other duties.

- The attached charts, showing personnel statistics per shift, are a misleading due to the limited amount of information than can be shown on one chart. The gray between the lines is when a dispatcher is absent from, for example, a midnight shift. In this case a dispatcher from the day shift has to come in four hours early while a dispatcher from the evening shift has to stay four hours late. Or a dayshift dispatcher may have worked an entire dayshift already, goes home for 8 hours and then comes back to work an 8 hour midnight shift. That leaves the upcoming dayshift short because a dayshift dispatcher worked midnights. Another option is an evening shift dispatcher, who is already on duty, goes home for a few hours and then returns to work the full 8 hour midnight shift. There are many scenarios on how to cover shifts but it can't be shown in any definitive manner for charting purposes.
- The Bella Vista Emergency Communications Center fields after hours calls for the Water Department and the Street Department.
- There are 3 current dispatchers that have between 12 & 15 years of experience.
- There are 3 current dispatchers that have between 5 & 7 years of experience.
- The Bella Vista Emergency Communications Center is the hub for Police, Fire, and EMS services. All dispatchers are trained in all three disciplines and serve as the first responder on every scene until emergency personnel arrive.
- Two of the three certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians for the Bella Vista Police Department are in the Communications Division. 65 car seats have been installed or inspected since they were certified in March of 2010.

Criminal Investigation Division

The Bella Vista Criminal Investigations Division (CID) is staffed by Lieutenant Barb Shrum, and Detectives Ed Williams and Mike Kugler. In 2010, CID was hit hard by two major events. The first was the deadly shooting by Officer Brackney. This required an internal investigation which produced approximately 100 hours of overtime. Detective Williams was assigned to view the autopsy at the Medical Examiner's office in Little Rock. Lieutenant Shrum and Detective Kugler viewed the dash video, interviewed Brackney and any other witnesses found, and revisited the scene many times in the next couple weeks. An internal investigation of this magnitude takes a toll on the investigators; both by fatigue, (in hours spent) and emotionally (investigating one of our own).

Just fifteen days later the second event was the heartbreaking death of a family of five in a house fire. Once again many hours were spent at the scene, with interviews, and investigation. We all have children of our own, and emotions were again tried as the bodies were located and removed from the home. Stress is high with this type of deadly incident.

On call time is split up between the two Lieutenants and two detectives. On call time is compensated due to the fact we are available to be contacted 24 hours a day. We have to be able to respond to the office within one hour. Each of us handles emergencies and/or administrative responsibilities for a week at a time. On Monday holidays, we will be on call for an extra 24 hours, so as not to break up the holiday weekend between two people.

The personnel in CID generated a total of 367 hours of overtime while on call in 2010. (That's an average of 122 hours each) There were 44 call outs, and 78 calls handled by phone from home. Not all of these hours were actually paid out at overtime rates. Often we will opt to take the hours off at regular wages, instead, which saves the city a great deal of money.

Lieutenant Barb Shrum is assigned the majority of the sex crimes and all forensic examinations on computers. She also tracks the sex offenders in Bella Vista, mailing assessment level notifications, and day to day maintenance of the records. She assigns investigations to the two detectives.

Detective Ed Williams handles all cases with suspects, and works a variety of cases from drugs to burglary or theft, and frauds. Ed also is charged with uniforms, the ordering and maintenance of all the supplies in that area. He also handles the burning of all drugs that come into the




evidence room through the Pyro-Med program. 1376 pounds of medications were burned in 2010.

Detective Mike Kugler is assigned to evidence and background checks for new personnel. Most of the crimes without a readily available suspect are forwarded to him. He makes basic phone contact with complainants on dead end cases.


Cases Forwarded to CID




Major Crime Trends

Patrol Division

2010 was a very difficult year for the Bella Vista Police Department due to manpower issues and having our first police shooting in the last 17 years. The Officers had to deal with short shifts almost the entire year of 2010. That problem has been addressed by the city. The Bella Vista Police Department hired three new extra Officers in December 2010 and they will be attending the Arkansas Police Academy in January 2011. These Officers were hired using the money from the sales tax that the citizens passed in 2009. These three new officers bring the patrol officer total up to 18 Officers. We have had a few promotions in 2010. Officer Terry Dickey was promoted to Evening Shift Corporal. Officer Eric Palmer was promoted to Midnight Shift Corporal. Our longtime Animal Control Officer Merle Weaver retired and Dispatcher Amber Bowman was promoted to Animal Control Officer.

The Bella Vista Police Department places great emphasis on training and was able to continue to make strides in 2010 even with the manpower issues. The Officers of the Bella Vista Police Department were able to train a total of 2246.5 hours in 2010; this is up from 2,113 hours in 2009. Cpl. Eric Palmer was trained as a professional instructor and firearms instructor. Officer Steve Spann was trained as a Field Training Officer (FTO) and that brings our FTO number to five Officers. Officer Charles Tomlin got certified as a child safety seat installer and has installed several car seats for members of the community. We are working on expanding our in-house classes in 2011 due to having more personnel and having more certified instructors with the department. Each of the in-house classes that we teach is certified through the state of Arkansas and the Officer's get credit for the classes that help them move up in the state certificate program. This allows our officers to get up to date training and helps to better serve our community. To better serve the community the department had its first Night Out a program to introduce our department to the community and to promote officer/citizen relationships.

The Bella Vista Police Department implemented a K-9 program in June 2010. K-9 Officer JD Jordan went to the Little Rock K-9 Academy in June 2010 to pick up our new K-9, Camo, and together they participated in a two week K-9 handler







class. When Officer Jordan returned he and K-9 Camo were certified through the National Narcotic Detector Dog Association (NNDDA). K-9 Camo is a dual purpose Belgian Malinois that can be used for drug detection, tracking, building and area searches and suspect apprehension. In 2010 Officer Jordan and K-9 Camo did several demonstrations for the community at churches, community organizations, child care facilities and other community functions. In 2011 we will be utilizing Officer Jordan and K-9 Camo more for interdiction, narcotic detection and community awareness through demonstrations and information.

Our Officers have made good use of the new BAC machine in 2010. The officers have run more than 150 tests on the BAC machine and made 88 D.W.I. arrests in 2010. The department also made a new policy on D.W.I. checkpoints late in the year and conducted two checkpoints in 2010 that showed to be very productive. We plan on conducting more D.W.I. checkpoints in 2011.

I am very proud of the attitude and professionalism the officers of this department showed in 2010. The officers were able to overcome the shortfalls that arose in 2010 and were able to continue the great service that our community has come to expect over the years.
